Students in all Catholic schools will recite special beatification prayer, and learn about life of Pope John Paul II and making of saints.

Beatification is an intermediate step toward sainthood in the Roman Catholic Church. At the May 1 Mass of Beatification in Rome, the former pontiff will become Blessed John Paul II. French nun, Sr. Marie Simon-Pierre's miraculous recovery from Parkinson's disease opened the way for the beatification process. In January, Pope

Benedict XVI certified the findings of a panel charged with investigating the alleged miracle ascribed to his predecessor. Hundreds of thousands of pilgrims are expected in Rome for the three-day program, which will be aired live on EWTN. Pope John Paul II visited the Archdiocese of Baltimore (oldest Catholic diocese in the United States) October 7-8, 1995, making stops at the Basilica (America's First Cathedral), Cathedral of Mary Our Queen, Oriole Park at Camden Yards, Our Daily Bread soup kitchen and St. Mary's Seminary & University (oldest American seminary.
