Saint of the Month

As Catholic Americans, the words "Founding Fathers" bring to mind famous people like John the Baptist or Abraham Lincoln. However, there are many less-known pioneers whose brave persistence in the very trying times of the early America have helped shape our nation's history. For example, St. Jean de Brébeuf, who was born in 1593 and a French native, is not well known, even though his life impacted so many. The Jesuit missionary arrived in America in 1625 to evangelize Native Americans, and lived a simple life in the Huron community for over 15 years. In 1648 the Iroquois declared a genocide to exterminate the Huron. When the Iroquois attacked the Huron village he lived in, Brébeuf and his assistant, Gabriel Lalemant, were captured.

Both were offered a chance to escape, but chose instead to stay with the Huron and help build their spiritual defenses in the face of the very physical torture. A small child caught in the tribal wars would later continue this mission of selflessness in the next generation of spiritual guides, and become the first canonized Native American saint. Her name was Kateri Tekakwitha. Brébeuf was canonized in 1930 with the seven other "North American martyrs", fellow missionaries caught in the Native American tribal wars. He is the patron saint of Canada. His feast day is October 19th.

Hot Topic

Pope Francis announced the future canonizations of both Pope John Paul II and Pope John XXIII in the upcoming spring on April 27, 2014. Through this decision, Pope Francis wants to provide a strengthened sense of unity among Catholics. The current pope also believes these soon-to-be saints rightfully deserve to become saints because of their contributions affecting people on a global scale, including the efforts of John Paul II who encouraged the fall of Communism in

his native Poland and across Eastern Europe, in addition to the efforts of John XXIII, who assembled the liberalizing Second Vatican Council, which ran from 1962 to 1965. The canonization of Pope John XXIII is a controversial issue because people can only attribute one miracle to his life, whereas sainthood usually requires the necessity of having two miracles attributed to a candidate for sainthood. Pope Francis greatly admires Pope John XXIII, and many people

believe his canonization is supported because it will take place during the fiftieth anniversary of the Second Vatican Council. Another reason for supporting this canonization derives from the decision to canonize Pope John Paul II, and the conservatives who initially opposed his canonization are pacified through this decision.
