Baltimore archdiocese ready for March for Life

Thousands of Catholics from the Archdiocese of Baltimore will converge on the nation's capital Jan. 22 to rally in support of the sanctity of life during the 37th annual March for Life.

Archbishop Edwin F. O'Brien will march side by side with archdiocesan groups along Constitution Avenue as they prayerfully make their way to the Supreme Court Building. Auxiliary Bishops Denis J. Madden and Mitchell T. Rozanski will also march part of the route after attending a youth "Rally for Life" at the Verizon Center that morning.

Parishes and schools from throughout the archdiocese are sending buses to the march, and many will offer special prayers at their morning Masses calling for the enactment of laws that recognize the right to life from conception to natural death.

"We have to make our voices heard," said Linda Brenegan, Respect Life coordinator for the Archdiocese of Baltimore. "I think lawmakers pay attention. They have to. I don't see how they can ignore the hundreds of thousands of people who show up people who will be voting in the next election."

Brenegan said she is concerned about making sure health care reform does not come at the expense of human life. She wants lawmakers to protect the conscience rights of health care workers who oppose abortion, and she called for the elimination of a health care amendment sponsored by Sen. Barbara Mikulski that would broaden abortion coverage.

"The Mikulski Amendment would define abortion as preventative care," Brenegan said, "and preventative care would be federally mandated for all insurance – public and private. That is very frightening."

Brenegan said she hopes the vote on health care reform happens after the march so that lawmakers hear from pro-life constituents.

An estimated 1,500 young people from the Baltimore archdiocese are expected to attend the youth "Rally for Life" at the Verizon Center.

Scott Miller, coordinator of adolescent faith formation in the Division of Youth and Young Adult Ministry, said he attended the first March for Life in 1974. He remembers more adults attending that day.

"That's not the case anymore," Miller said. "This is a young people crowd. It's young people celebrating life together and celebrating faith together."

Miller said the archdiocese has developed a special pro-life curriculum that will be used in schools and parishes for young people who are not attending the March for Life.

St. Mary, Hagerstown, is hosting a Rock for Life Concert Jan. 16 featuring the band, Alakrity. St. John Neumann in Annapolis will have Life Week activities starting with Joia Farmer in concert Jan. 15.

Two Youth Rallies for Life will be held Jan. 21, each from 7 to 9 p.m. at St. Peter, Libertytown and St. Mary, Hagerstown.

"Our young people are much more receptive to a respect life message," Miller said.
