"Randy remembered me right away," said Plunkett, whose regular service includes being an usher at his parish, St. Margaret in Bel Air.

Mike Jones, 58, a Gallagher Services client who resides not far from Calvert Hall, regaled some younger Cardinals with his sports knowledge.

"It's a pretty good day," Jones said. "I'm playing basketball. That's a plus right there."

Stevie McDonald, the coordinator of spiritual development for Gallagher Services, cited the timing of the outreach.

"With this winter being so confining, this is wonderful for our clients," she said. "They love it."

William J. McCarthy, executive director of Catholic Charities of Baltimore, was among those who stopped by Calvert Hall.
