Congress culpable too

I read Michael Madden's response (CR, Oct. 16) to my letter, which stated that I was incorrect when I said Congress "prepares the budget." Let's look at the recent so-called "bail out" bill that the President sent to Congress which was three pages long and rejected by Congress.
