

CRS thanks St. Vincent de Paul for generous donation

Baltimore-based Catholic Relief Services President Ken Hackett formally thanked Archbishop Edwin F. O'Brien and St. Vincent de Paul of Baltimore for nearly \$18,000 in recent contributions to fund aid for people in impoverished parts of the world.

"Your gift will have a profound impact on the lives of the people we serve in our efforts to alleviate the suffering of the innocent and provide secure havens of hope and peace around the world," said Mr. Hackett, a parishioner of St. Louis, Clarksville, in a Nov. 7 letter to the new archbishop of Baltimore. "I spent time in Ethiopia this summer and saw firsthand the importance of our work among the impoverished, the sick, the vulnerable, and the desperate."
