Kibler will officially take her position Sept. 8.

Joining her in the Division of Catechetical and Pastoral Formation is Carlos Castaneda, who will become coordinator of Hispanic pastoral formation Sept. 14.

Castaneda most recently served as director of the Hispanic ministry program for the Diocese of Charlotte, N.C., where he was responsible for identifying, developing and implementing programs and processes for the formation of lay ministers.

With a master's degree from Boston College, Castaneda has also worked as a video editor and producer for various companies. His first vocation is as a husband and father.
