Here are some questions Quintessential Careers recommends:

- 1. How would you describe yourself?
- 2. Why did you leave your last job?
- 3. Why did you choose this career?
- 4. How well do you work with people? Do you prefer working alone or in teams?
- 5. How would you evaluate your ability to deal with conflict?
- 6. Describe the best job you've ever had.
- 7. What are the most important rewards you expect in your career?
- 8. What do you see yourself doing five years from now? Ten years from now?
- 9. How do you plan to achieve your career goals?
- 10. Can you explain this gap in your employment history?
- 11. Have you ever been fired or forced to resign?
- 12. Do you consider yourself a leader?
- 13. What two or three accomplishments have given you the most satisfaction? Why?
- 14. How well do you adapt to new situations?
- 15. In what kind of work environment are you most comfortable?

- 16. What do you consider to be your greatest strengths and weaknesses?
- 17. How do you work under pressure?
- 18. What's one of the hardest decisions you've ever had to make?
- 19. Describe the workload in your current (or most recent) job.
- 20. In what ways do you think you can make a contribution to our company/organization?

Here are a few questions I've found useful and thought were worth sharing:

- 1. What four or five words would describe you best?
- 2. Please give an example of a customer service situation that you felt you handled well. Please give an example that you could have handled better.
- 3. Please tell me about your career decisions you've made; which were good decisions and which were bad decisions? What did you learn as a result of those decisions?
- 4. Describe a detailed project that you handled from start to finish.
- 5. What would your current (or most recent) boss tell me about your work performance?
- 6. What would your employee/s tell me about your management style?
- 7. Why are you a good fit for our organization?
- 8. What motivates you to come to work every day?
- 9. Describe a problem at work that you solved satisfactorily. How do you approach and resolve problems?
- 10. How do you keep "up-to-date" and prepared to do your best work?
