Regional Youth Training



The Division of Youth and Young Adult Ministry is pleased to make youth training now available in a more cost-effective, time-sensitive, and collaborative manner.

Regional youth ministry groups are encouraged to survey their own programming needs and consider

sponsoring one (or more) of the five programs available on the right.

Each program provides up to six hours in programming content. The schedule of each program will extend to add ice-breakers, a meal, and closing Mass/ prayer.

Booking of the program must take place no later than 10 weeks in advance of the program. This allows time to schedule the program director as well as offer publicity throughout all of the Archdiocese related to the program.

It is anticipated that there is a 20 person minimum attendance needed for each program with most of the participants coming from the host region. Maximum at the discretion of the Program Leader, but should be no more than 40.


Cost of the program will be \$240. For this fee, the Archdiocese will hire the program director to facilitate the program, handle registration and supplies and materials, and ensure publicity efforts.

The host site / region will be responsible for setting the fee of the program. This should be based on the fee of the program as well as on any hospitality that the host will provide (snacks, meal, etc.) Example: An anticipated participant count of 30 could be charged \$15 for the day (\$8 for the program fee, \$5 for hospitality, and \$2 for profit for the host. It is the

host's discretion to request lunch be brown-bagged or that they will provide pizza or a more substantial meal (which might be donated by a parish group at no additional cost t the program.)

Further, the host site / region will be responsible

- for 20 minutes of ice-breakers at beginning of the program;
- to ensure the recruitment and practice of no less than two, no more than four peer ministers to serve in general presentation. (exception has been asked, presently, for Cornerstone, who will travel with their own peers); and




