A funeral Mass for Sister Mary Alice Ashton, O.S.F. (formerly Sister Robert Ann), was offered June 19 at St. Anthony of Padua and Holy Redeemer Cemetery, Baltimore. Monsignor Joseph L. Luca, pastor of St. Louis, Clarksville, officiated.

Sister Mary Alice died June 12; she was 67 and a professed member of the Sisters of St. Francis of Philadelphia for 39 years. A native of Baltimore, she was a parishioner of Cathedral of Mary Our Queen, Homeland.

At the time of her death, the nun was traveling from California to begin a new ministry at The Catholic High School of Baltimore.

Sister Mary Alice is survived by a sister, Sister Susanne Ashton, R.S.M.; two brothers, William Ashton and Peter Ashton; and two step-brothers, Robert Lundquist and Phillip Lundquist.
