## Susan Banks is new principal of St. Agnes School

For 13 years, she taught at Forbush Secondary School on the Towson campus of Sheppard and Enoch Pratt Hospital. Ms. Banks holds a bachelor's degree in education from Towson University and a master's degree in education from Loyola College in Maryland, Baltimore.
