

VFW chooses teacher of the year

While presenting Science fair awards Jan. 19 to middle school students at St. Philip Neri School, Linthicum, Fran Meeks unsuspectingly received an award of her own – teacher of the year.

The eighth grade science and homeroom teacher with 33 years of service received a plaque and \$250 from VFW Post #304, Annapolis. On hand with the surprise was commander Kenneth R. Smith and quartermaster Richard W. Walker, parishioner of St. Mary, Annapolis.
