




A GREETING FROM Dr. Ronald Valentí

Division of Youth and Young Adult Ministry. The DYYAM finds itself in transition as, after twenty-three years of exemplary service, Director Mark Pacione has moved to the Office of Schools Planning. At the same time, you will find within the pages of this Directory of Services that Christ's "energizing spirit" continues to compel the staff and mission of the DYYAM forward.

Secondly, on January 22nd, the March for Life empowers young people to advocate on behalf of those most vulnerable. Lastly, Archbishop O'Brien's annual Pilgrimage for Youth and Young Adults will be held on March 27, 2010 and all parishes are expected to provide a delegation for the event.

May we find ourselves constantly thirsting for a deeper love of Christ during this time of transition and always.

Purpose:

The Division of Youth and Young Adult Ministry exists to provide direction and leader-ship in ministry to younger and older adolescents, and young adults. The Division fosters a comprehensive approach to these ministries, encouraging parishes, Catholic elementary and high schools to be responsive to the spiritual, emotional, psychological, social and physical development of youth and young adults.

The work of evangelization and catechesis are particularly important areas of focus for the Division of Youth and Young Adult Ministry. Evangelization is the work of the whole church and the staff works to help the Church be perceived by youth and young adults as a place of welcome and a worthy adventure. Likewise, our catechetical efforts seek to assist those who are leading young people in the ways of Christian discipleship.

The Division supports a ministry to, with, by and for youth which "seeks to draw young people to a responsible participation in the life, mission and work of the Catholic faith community." (Renewing the Vision, USCC, 1997) To this end, the Msgr. O'Dwyer Retreat House assists by guiding young people toward a better understanding of themselves, others and God by providing quality retreats rooted in the Catholic Tradition.

The Division supports ministry to young adults which "connects young adults with Jesus Christ, the Church, the mission of the church in the world, and a peer community in which their faith is nurtured and strengthened." (Sons and Daughters of the Light, USCC, 1996)

The Office of Higher Education provides Catholic campus ministry, gathering "the Catholics on campus for prayer, worship and learning in order that they might bring the light of the Gospel to illumine the concerns and hopes of the academic community." (Empowered by the Spirit: Campus Ministry Faces the Future, NCCB, 1985).

<u>Project C</u>: The middle-school years are a challenging and turbulent time of growth for young people, including within their spiritual lives. The Church has always proclaimed that parents are the primary religious educators of their young people; $Project\ C$ honors this by assisting parents in engaging their own young people in a season of conversation about faith. This program, following last year's $Project\ Be$ is a program that encourages parents to have conversations regarding the Creed, spend some time Ceeking (Seeking) the Lord in prayer, and considering how you might C (see) themselves as disciples

on Jesus in the future.

 $Project\ C$ begins in the Easter Season, a traditionally quiet time for middle school religious education programming.

The program requires a daily conversation within the family home, averaging around ten minutes a day. The program is written for the parents, empowering them to engage and lead the conversation. Many of the sessions address elements of the Creed while also sharing the stories of those saints who have served as Doctors of the Church. Basic prayers are examined and shared. The Sunday Gospels are also considered for further reflection and examination. There is time set aside for family activities as well

as a Parish/School gathering: The Center Event. The program concludes with a weeklong

examination of vocation or how we see ourselves in the future.

mands of infant care. YOUTH MINISTRY CERTIFICATION

Ensuring the quality of pastoral care provided by lay ecclesial ministers requires a process for deciding that a given candidate has the education, formation, and professional skills necessary to serve in a particular role.

This involves establishing the requirements for education, formation, and experience for specific ministerial roles and evaluating the extent to which individuals meet these requirements. This may vary from diocese to diocese, but the competence of those who serve needs to be verified in some way.

Application for Youth Ministry Certification is made through the Division of Youth and Young Adult Ministry. Four levels of achievement are recognized:

- → Youth Ministry Certificate Level I 30 Clock Hours
- ☆ Youth Ministry Certificate Level II
 60 Clock Hours

- ☆ Advanced Certificate in Youth Ministry 100 Clock hours
- ☆ Professional Certificate in Youth Ministry 18 Academic Credits, graduate or undergraduate

Clock hours and academic credits must be distributed between the 4 areas of growth as defined in *Rooted in the Vision*, 2001. All updated applications for certification on any level must include training on the renewing the Vision document to be considered. Professional Certification is the expectation of those in service as a professional coordinator of director of a youth ministry in a parish

Additional Delivery Systems for Youth Ministry Training: Book Clubs, Independent Study, and e-Learning. Recognized training opportunities provided by parishes, schools, and academic institutions. To request approval for local training contact the Division

<u>Specializations in Youth Ministry Certification</u>: Recognizing the diversity of skills needed for Youth Ministry, specializations are being developed that can be attained within Youth Ministry Certification at Level II and the Advanced Certificate in Youth Ministry. These areas of specialization include Catechesis and Pastoral Care

Criteria for these specializations may include a core course, details are available from Division of Youth and Young Adult Ministry.



Archdiocesan Coaches Training: This training is required for anyone who coaches for an Archdiocesan parish or elementary school. The training is 4 hours and is held at multiple times and sites throughout the Archdiocese. Understanding the challenge to recruit and screen new volunteers for coaching positions, the coaches training requirement allows for a one season grace period. Any coach who chooses to continue coaching must complete the training prior to coaching a second season. The Division of Youth and Young Adult Ministry can assist with the development of a job description and orientation of the newly hired coordinator of parish youth ministry.




Consultation and Services




Beyond the Boundaries:
