#### Introduction

The definitive aim of catechesis is to put people not only in touch, but also in communion and intimacy with Jesus Christ.<sup>1</sup>

Every Catholic Parish is a place to encounter the living God who in Jesus Christ reveals his transforming love and truth. By providing a safe, holy, and loving environment, catechists encourage life-long conversion and living faith in Jesus Christ. Indeed, when good catechesis occurs, catechists and students reveal the living God to one another. It is through this encounter with God, and by forming a personal relationship with Jesus Christ, that children build a strong foundation for lifelong discipleship. Throughout this curriculum, it must be remembered that instruction in the tenets of the faith is not enough to develop this relationship—the experience of prayer, faith sharing, Christian service, worship, and a faithful home environment are important. This Elementary Faith Formation Curriculum, coupled with a faith-filled catechist, is an invaluable resource for fulfilling this aim and passing our faith on to a new generation.

Our Catholic faith is a shared, experienced, and proclaimed faith. Our faith demands to be known. Our faith demands to be lived, both with God through prayer and with the Christian community through mission. Ultimately, our faith demands to be celebrated! The work of catechesis is defined in the *General Directory for Catechesis* (GDC) as diverse, yet interrelated, tasks. Each of these tasks is important, and together they offer a comprehensive approach towards faith formation. These tasks are accomplished through both the transmission of the Gospel message and experience of the Christian life.

Special thanks is due to the Archdioceses of Washington and Chicago for permissions granted to build upon the firm foundation of their standards-based curricula and to use elements of each

of their standards and indicators in creating this new Archdiocesan Religion Curriculum Guide.

Our work was also greatly enhanced by the guiding principles of the Diocese of Wilmington.

#### The Tasks of Catechesis

Catechesis must help one to know, celebrate, and contemplate the mystery of Jesus Christ. Further, catechesis must help one to develop a personal relationship with Jesus Christ. In doing so, catechesis also prepares Christians to live in community and participate actively in the life and mission of the Church. (cf. GDC, no. 85-86). These fundamental tasks, also known as "duties," of catechesis, as expressed in the GDC are:

# Promoting knowledge of the faith

Catechesis provides experiences to allow one to encounter Christ; and helps those who have encountered Christ know and love him more. Catechesis leads believers to gradually grasp the content of God's self-revelation, found in Sacred Scripture and Sacred Tradition. Catechesis promotes knowledge and understanding of the mysteries of the faith we proclaim in the Creed. By deepening the faith, catechesis nourishes the life of faith and equips Christ's disciples to explain their faith to others. (cf. GDC, no. 85)

#### Liturgical education

Christ is present in his Church, especially in the sacraments. Catechesis leads believers to "full, conscious, and active participation" in the liturgy, so that they may live out their baptismal call: to carry on the mission of Christ in the world. The closest possible communion Catholics experience with Jesus on earth is in the reception of his living Body and Blood in the Eucharist. Catechesis for liturgy also educates the disciples of Jesus Christ "for prayer, for thanksgiving, for repentance, for praying with confidence, for community spirit, for understanding correctly the meaning of the creeds." (cf. GDC, no. 85)

#### **Moral formation**

"Conversion to Jesus Christ implies walking in his footsteps." Catechesis encourages the faithful to give witness to Christ and his Church's teaching in everyday life by transmitting the content

of Christ's moral teachings. Evangelization which involves catechesis for morality "displays all the force of its appeal where it offers not only the proclaimed word but the lived word, too. The moral testimony, which is prepared for by catechesis, must always demonstrate the social consequences of the demands of the Gospel." (GDC, no. 85)

#### Teaching to pray

The most effective catechesis is permeated by a climate of prayer. Communion with Jesus Christ leads the disciples to an attitude of prayer and contemplation. As the GDC says, "To learn to pray with Jesus is to pray with the same sentiments with which he turned to the Father: adoration, praise, thanksgiving, filial confidence, supplication and awe for his glory" Passing on the Our Father, the model of all Christian prayer, is a true act of catechesis and the summary of the whole Gospel. (cf. GDC, no. 85)

# **Education for Community Life**

Jesus said to his disciples, "Love one another as I have loved you." (John 13:34). This command guides the disciple's life in the Church and in the global community. Catechesis encourages an apprenticeship in Catholic living, a spirit of simplicity and humility, care for the poor and alienated, fraternal correction, common prayer, and mutual forgiveness. The Church is built up by the special graces and gifts received by members of the Body of Christ. Ecumenical charity and sensitivity, as well as zeal for unity among Christians, also are emphasized. (cf. GDC, no. 85)

#### **Missionary initiation**

Catechesis forms disciples who bear witness to their Catholic faith in society through their professional, cultural and social lives. It also encourages vocations to the priesthood and religious life. Catechesis nourishes in all the faithful the attitudes which Jesus taught his disciples when he sent them on mission: "to seek out the lost sheep, proclaim and heal at the same time, to be poor, without money or knapsack, to know how to accept rejection and persecution; to place one's trust in the Father and in the support of the Holy Spirit; to expect no other reward than the joy of working for the Kingdom". Catechesis recognizes that other religious traditions reflect "seeds of the Word" that can allow for both "interreligious dialogue" and "evangelization" (cf. GDC, no. 86).

# **Standards-based Curriculum**

The Archdiocese of Baltimore Parish Faith Formation Elementary Curriculum, *Bringing Good News*, is a standards-based curriculum that flows from the Six Tasks of Catechesis, as published in the *General Directory of Catechesis* and described above.

#### **Christian Service**

Parish Faith Formation Programs provide opportunities to encourage children and young people to participate in Christian service. We participate in service out of a desire to share Christ's love. "To love someone is to desire that person's good and to take effective steps to secure it. Besides the good of the individual, there is a good that is linked to living in society: the common good"<sup>2</sup>.

Each Parish Faith Formation Program in the Archdiocese of Baltimore should provide opportunities for service. Service-learning integrates meaningful Christian service with

instruction and reflection which enriches the learning experience. Service to others, especially the poor and the marginalized, is a powerful means for children and youth to encounter Christ.

#### **Catechesis for Family Life**

The Archdiocese of Baltimore is committed to providing children and their parents/guardians a holistic catechesis for family life. This catechesis includes an understanding of the call to live a chaste life. *Catechesis for Family Life* enables participants to develop an understanding of the dignity and value of all human life. It also includes safe environment training for children and education about sexual abuse. Catechesis for Family Life is an integral part of the curriculum for faith formation in the Parish School of Religion. #### **Evangelization**

In essence, the Parish Faith Formation Program is an evangelizing ministry, which is guided by the Holy Spirit and faithful to the continuing mission of the Church (United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, *Go and Make Disciples*, 136 D). Evangelization occurs when people are so ablaze with the fire of God's love that they cannot help but witness to and share their faith with others. The essential mission of the Church today is the same as it was over two centuries ago, to proclaim the Good News, to bring the message of salvation and the Kingdom into every facet of human life, and to transform our culture through the power and love of Jesus Christ.
