
## **FY20 Budget Overview**

Budget Area	Est. Expense	Primary Restraint/ Budget Policy
Central Service Core Operations	\$25.6 million (11.2) million \$14.4 million	Must stay within Cathedraticum. Estimated fees and other income help offset cathedraticum burden.
External Assistance (1)	\$4.7 million	Must stay within income generated from unrestricted gifts and interest income and dividends
Insurance Health Benefits Risk	\$47.3 million \$5.9 million \$11.8 million	All insurance programs are sustained by premiums paid by participants of the program – parish/schools/agencies of the Archdiocese.

(1) External assistance does not include approximately \$9 million in annual grants provided by the Archdiocese made possible from the funds raised in the Annual Appeal and Catholic Community Foundation.




# Catholic Center Core Operating Budget – FY20 Allocation of \$14.4 Million Cathedraticum

# What Generates the \$14.4 million of Cathedraticum?

- Assessment base is on parish unrestricted income
- Step % is applied to base
  - 1<sup>ST</sup> \$100k of base assessed 6.5%
  - 2<sup>ND</sup> \$100k of base assessed 12.5%
  - Income based over \$200k assessed 15.5%
- No campaign-related collections or parish share income from Archdiocesean annual/capital appeals are included in base.
- Deductions on taxable income are given for tuition assistance and Catholic Review expenditures and any expense associated with revenue generated activity such as child care services, religious education and evangelization programs.

- Top 10 parishes generate 25% of total (Nativity was largest in FY18. Tax represented 14% of operating income and 15% of operating expense)
- Next 50 parishes generate 52% of total (represents, on average, 11.8% of operating income)
- Remaining 82 parishes generate 23% (St. Michael, Clear Spring, smallest. Tax represents 4.8% of operating income and 3.8% of operating expense)

# Department of Development FY20 Budget and Use of Cathedraticum

**Annual Appeal for Catholic Ministries** \$6-8 million campaign. Parishes receive approx. \$2.5 million in parish share.

**Partners in Excellence** – Provides \$1 million in tuition assistance to disadvantaged families in Balto. city.

**Catholic Community Foundation** – Total Endowments have reached \$85 million, providing \$3.1 million in funds to parishes/schools across Archdiocese.

**Annual gala** provides additional \$300k in funding for school tuition assistance.

**Embracing Our Mission** capital campaign \$100 million goal is achieved. Funding school capital projects, tuition assistance, school endowments, clergy retirement programs, support of cathedrals and evangelization.


