THE PASTORATE PLANNING EXPERIENCE - CASTING INTO NEW WATERS

Jesus said to them, 'Children, have you caught anything to eat?' They answered him, 'No.' So he said to them, 'Cast the net over the right side of the boat and you will find something.' So they cast it, and were not able to pull it in because of the number of fish." (John 21:5-6)

How many times have we been frustrated by the empty nets we pull up from what have always seemed good ways of spreading the Gospel? What is holding us back from going outside our comfort zone to evangelize and make disciples in new ways? Perhaps it is fear of failure or push back, lack of energy, or maybe just the need for inspiration? Jesus is calling us to be "fishers of men" in new ways, and the rewards are worth it!

BEARING FRUIT IN A TIME OF CRISIS

Many of the pastorates in the pilot (2017) and Phase 1A (2018) cohorts have continued to plan and implement their strategies for missionary discipleship, even during these times of crisis.

Pastorates are using their strategic plans to prioritize their activities and allocate their resources in ways that focus on growing and making disciples. The crisis has been a catalyst for pastorates to jump into their online presence, create virtual small faith communities, and update the contact information of their parishioners.

THE 2019 COHORT: PERSEVERANCE PAYS OFF

 <u>Priorities Workbook</u> with your team to start putting ideas for missionary transformation on paper.
- 4. Build a strong and healthy team that is mission-focused. Start by praying together every day and sharing your faith journey. Discover each other's strengths and how best to lead and minister out of them.
- 5. Begin envisioning with your team what a pastorate full of missionary disciples could look like in action.
