Tarcisus was a Roman boy during the time that Christians had to meet secretly for Mass. One day, Tarcisus offered to take the Eucharist to prisoners. On the way, he was attacked, kicked, and beaten by other boys, but he refused to let them have the Eucharist. His injuries were severe, and he died protecting the Eucharist. St. Tarcisus is a patron saint of altar servers; his feast day is August 15th.
