
Fr. Mike Depcik will be here for Mass in ASL on the following weekends:


We are planning a group trip to the Museum of the Bible in





Are you interested in learning more about what we believe as Catholics? Maybe there are some things that you missed out on in your faith development. Maybe you never had the sacrament of Confirmation. Maybe you are not Catholic and want to learn about the Catholic faith or want to join the Catholic Church. We will be having a study group that will focus on What We Believe: The Beauty of the Catholic Faith. In fact, we will have two groups that meet every other week on Zoom, one on Sunday evenings, and another on Thursday evenings beginning after Labor Day. We will use a captioned video and discussion. After several months of work and prayer, the Advisory Committee on Deaf Ministry has completed the archdiocesan Pastoral Plan for Deaf Ministry. A meeting with Archbishop Lori is planned for late September or early October to present the plan. The plan looks at seven Core Mission Priorities (Welcome/ Hospitality/Community, Encounter with Jesus Christ, Worship/Liturgy/ Sacraments, Accompaniment, Participation, Sending Forth, and Mission Support). Barriers were identified and strategies developed to address the issues. Six Priority Strategies were identified to focus on and Action Steps developed. Four Action Groups are being formed to work on implementation of the plan. The four groups are: Training for Parishes, Retreats, Interpreting, and Get-togethers/Regional Meetings. 
