## Faithful and Safe Online

Digital technology saves us time and enhances our lives in so many ways. We use our devices to connect with friends, loved ones, colleagues, and even strangers. Children watch and learn from us, and they want to participate. How do we communicate to young children the dangers of the online world and teach them to use good judgment

about technology? We can begin by setting age-

appropriate rules and expectations about technology in the home and carrying our relationship with Jesus into all of our online activity.

## Your child's online environment needs to be as safe and positive as the home environment you provide for your child.

Your child needs clearly defined rules for online behavior in order to stay safe. Teach your child to check with you before using a digital device. Help your child develop the habit of showing you pop-ups that appear on the screen, and stress the importance of never sharing passwords or personal information.

Take advantage of parental controls to manage screen time and help filter out inappropriate content. Provide for your child a list of games or apps he or she is able to access freely, and keep your child close while he or she is online so that you can monitor his or her activities. Above all, let your child see you conduct your activity online according to your shared Catholic faith and principles.

## Reflection

The internet and social media offer many opportunities for connection and learning, but they also expose us to aspects of our culture that may not be in keeping with our values. It is important that we compare what we see, hear, and read with our Christian values so that we may find God's truth in the midst of everything. Paul reminds us that we are called to renew our minds in Christ, and we will be led to choices that are good and pleasing to God.

# Lead Your Child to Grow with God: Spiritually, Socially, and Physically

**Spiritual** Choose short Scripture verses to recite with your child from memory—especially those that relate to being loving and safe within relationships, such as John 13:34 and John 14:27.

**Social** Pretend with your child. Act out parables or social scenes that might play out in the classroom or with friends. Encourage your child to consider how each person might feel in the scenarios and which actions are most pleasing to God.

**Physical** Get physical and creative with your worship and praise. Help your child develop fine motor skills while nurturing his or her relationship with Jesus by crafting, coloring, and



writing together. For example, write a favorite Bible verse, read it to your child, and work together to draw a picture to illustrate it.


## Big Ideas

## STEP 1

## **ENGAGE & EXPLORE**

SAY: Chatting with our friends and family and playing games online are fun things to do. What are some other things you like to do with a digital device? Allow your child time to respond. Share some ideas of your own. Remind your child that he or she should always ask permission before using a digital device.

Use the blackline master to discuss or establish rules about your child's use of technology at home. Post the rules in a prominent place in your home, and help your child read the



rules each time he or she uses a digital device.


## Bringing the Lesson Home (continued)

#### STEP 2 **REFLECT & RESPOND**

Read or complete Side B of the worksheet with your child.

**SAY:** Jesus teaches us to be kind and to make good choices. That includes the time we spend online and the way in which we use our digital devices. We treat people and our things gently to share the love of Jesus we have in our hearts.

**SAY:** Let us pray together. Pray the prayer from the Pray Together feature or a prayer of your own. Begin and end the prayer with the Sign of the Cross.
