A Calling for Families

God's plan is for family members to help children develop a strong relationship with him. When families go to church, children take joy in celebrating God's love by singing songs of praise and learning Bible stories. In so doing, they learn they are valuable in God's eyes and loved



unconditionally. They learn we are all God's children, and we are called to know him and love him above all things.

Your first grader is learning and observing every day. He or she is making assumptions and judgments about experiences. Look for opportunities to clarify misconceptions about faith, ideas, or self-worth. Children need to hear often about God's love for them.

Hearing gentle and sincere words of affirmation from you and other family members will help your child develop a sense of self that is rooted in God's truth—as well as develop the ability to see others through God's eyes.

The Holy Family nurtured Jesus. They helped him grow and learn and practice his faith. They fulfilled God's plan faithfully. God calls all parents to do the same for their children.

Reflection

Paul reminds us that the Spirit of God leads us the same way the Spirit of God led the Holy Family—the very sacred model for family life. How can we compare to such perfection? When we seek God's presence in our daily lives and act according to the guidance of the Holy Spirit, we become vessels of God's goodness and benevolence, and we serve his kingdom faithfully.

Lead Your Child to Grow with God: Spiritually, Socially, and Physically

Spiritual Young children love to sing, and music provides a wonderful avenue to explore God's love for us and his presence in our lives. Sing simple songs of praise and worship together in the car, while making dinner, or at bedtime.

Social Take every opportunity to gather with extended family, close friends, and your parish community so that your child begins to value relationships. Teach your child that healthy relationships help one grow and learn and become closer to God.

Physical All too often, self-image becomes rooted in one's physical appearance. Help your child focus on and develop a sense of gratitude for the wonderful things his or her God-given body can do, such as play baseball, ride a bicycle, or simply hug and care for loved ones.

Bringing the Lesson Home

Determine ahead of time when and where you and your child will engage with the lesson content. Read or complete Side A of the worksheet with your child.



STEP 1

ENGAGE & EXPLORE

Take a moment to listen to your child talk about the drawing of your family.

SAY: When you came into our family, you changed it for

Invite your child to share some of his or her earliest memories of what you did together as a family and of plans for activities that will make new memories. Allow time for your child to answer.
