## LITURGY & WELCOMING

**We recognize...** That transparency of history, whether it be good or bad is valuable in lessons learned from the past.

**We believe...** strongly in the liveliness, reverence, and inclusivity of our liturgy; and we are fueled by relatable homilies that connect us to Christ and each other, and how great song and powerful music can feed our souls with the Holy Spirit.

**We understand...** that personal invitation and follow-up can go a long way; as we strive to welcome and accept people for who they are: African American, Hispanics, elderly, youth, immigrants, LGBTQ+ and people on the margins.



## ENCOUNTER & ACCOMPANIMENT

We are called to walk with one another as missionary disciples that ENCOUNTER and ACCOMPANY our brothers and sisters through the bumpy roads of life; helping them to grow spiritually and live the Gospel more fully through prayer, sacrament, faith formation and friendship!
