

I am honored to announce that Archbishop William Lori has invited Fr. Michael Depcik, OSFS, to come to the Archdiocese of Baltimore to be the Chaplain for Deaf Ministry beginning sometime this summer. Fr. Mike has answered, "Yes," to the invitation. For thirteen years, Fr. Mike has been the Director of the St. John's Deaf Center in Detroit, Michigan. He grew up in a Deaf family in Chicago and attended the St. Rita School for the Deaf in Cincinnati, OH. He has a Master of Arts degree in Divinity from Ss. Cyril & Methodius Seminary and a Master of Arts degree in Mental Health Counseling from Gallaudet University. He was ordained in June 2000 and joined the Oblates of St. Francis de Sales. Fr. Mike is one of fewer than two dozen culturally Deaf priests in the world and nine in the U.S. Welcome, Fr. Mike!

On Saturday, June 24, Deacon Luke Koski is scheduled to be ordained a priest for the Archdiocese of Baltimore. Deacon Luke has been working to improve his ASL so that he can celebrate the sacraments in ASL. **Please save the date and plan to attend the ordination.** As a deacon, Luke has served at St. John the Evangelist in Frederick and St. Joseph on Carrollton Manor in Buckeystown. In July 2022, Luke participated in a week-long Religious ASL training in Rockford, Illinois with Msgr. Glenn Nelson, Deacon Patrick Graybill, and interpreter Joan Macv.

On January 19, several Members of the Advisory Committee on Deaf Ministry met with Archbishop William Lori and shared with him archdiocesan the **Pastoral Plan for Deaf Ministry**. Present for the meeting were: Marie Williams, Carol Polizzi, Cathy Babb, and Chris Duck. Julie St. Croix, the Director of the Office of Parish Renewal, who helped guide the committee through the development process, was also present.

Six priority strategies were identified in the Pastoral plan to be focused on initially.




