Some Notes About This Resource List:

This list is not exhaustive, nor are any of these materials mandated for use in the Archdiocese of Baltimore. However, a threefold set of requirements does remain in force:

- Confirmation Preparation must follow the Confirmation Preparation Framework and consist of a maximum of 6-8 sessions.
- Children’s catechesis (including sacramental prep) in the Archdiocese of Baltimore **MUST** take place within a holistic Family Faith Formation approach, including formation with and for parents. *(In part to facilitate this family-focused approach, all immediate prep for sacraments takes place in the parish/pastorate, NOT in the Catholic school.)*
- Within the particular Family Faith Formation model discerned by the parish/pastorate, approved Family Life Catechesis curriculum MUST be integrated into the catechetical cycle.

If you are interested in using a resource not listed here, simply consult the Office of Family, Youth, and Young Adult Ministry.

- A proposed resource does NOT need to be on the USCCB Conformity List, but it must align with Catholic magisterial teaching.
- Conversely, resources which are approved via the USCCB Conformity List may not be appropriate for your context or integrate well with the required family faith formation approach.

Inclusion on this list is not to be construed as a wholesale endorsement in every time and place. If you would like assistance discerning the best resource to use in your context, please consult the Office of Family, Youth, and Young Adult Ministry.
